Elisa Crespo joined Stonewall Community Foundation as Executive Director in November 2024. Prior to Stonewall, Elisa spent several transformative years as the founding executive director of the NEW Pride Agenda, where she built the emerging organization from the ground up, creating a thriving state-wide advocacy powerhouse. Elisa was instrumental in the implementation of New York State's multi-million-dollar Lorena Borjas Transgender and Nonbinary Wellness & Equity Fund, one of the first of its kind in the country. After graduating from John Jay College, where she studied political science and human rights, Elisa held numerous community organizing roles and served as the Education Liaison to the Bronx Borough President. As a trans Latina woman, Elisa is a trailblazer in the nonprofit sector, where just 5% of NYC-area nonprofit leaders are Latina women.

Elisa's movement building efforts have been profiled in numerous media outlets including Them, LGBTQ Nation, OUT Magazine, Marie Claire and NBC News. Her work in the LGBTQ+ community has been recognized by several leading organizations including In Our Own Voices, New York Transgender Advocacy Group, Gay City News, the NYC LGBT Center, Stonewall Democrats of NYC, Lambda Independent Democrats of Brooklyn, the Manhattan Democratic Party, the Bronx Democratic Party, Colectivo Intercultural TRANSgrediendo, GMHC, the NYC Comptroller's Office, and more. Elisa has been featured in City & State New York's "40 under 40" list and graced the cover of their 2023 Pride Power 100 issue. A lifelong New Yorker, Elisa made history in 2020 as the first trans woman to run for public office in the Bronx.

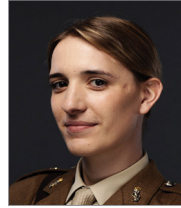
Kit Morey

In 2013 Hannah came out as a transgender woman and became one of the highest ranking transgender soldiers within the British Army. As part of the Army LGBT Forum, she became the Army's Transgender Representative where she had responsibility to advise Senior Army commanders on transgender policy, educate the wider Defence and most importantly, mentor and support the Army's many transgender soldiers.

Citing the positive effect that openly trans people had on her own transition, Hannah was very keen to become a visible role model for others, in particular showing that transgender women don't have to be pigeon holed into stereotypically feminine jobs.

Hannah made the decision to share her personal story of transition with the UK press, and her story quickly went viral with pick up across the world's media outlets. She has since conducted frequent TV interviews as a transgender advocate including appearances on Lorraine, The One Show, Good Morning Britain and The Victoria Derbyshire Show.

Since coming out, Hannah has received recognition in the form of awards from the British LGBT Awards, Cosmopolitan Ultimate Women Awards, Stonewall, Out in Work 100 Awards and an Honorary Fellowship from Cardiff University.

Hannah has always been keen to use her platform to better the lives of other LGBTQ people and supports as many charities and events as possible. In 2015 she became the first Patron of the charity Mermaids and as an active and competitive person, Hannah is an Ambassador for LGBT Sport Cymru (Wales). She has also been a judge for the British LGBT Awards and supports other organisations such as Pride in London, Trans Military and the Being Me charity.

Hannah was awarded an MBE in the 2019 New Years Honours List, receiving the award from HRH The Duke of Cambridge in June 2019.

Following retirement from the British Army in 2019, Hannah embarked on an exciting new career within the financial sector. Bringing her leadership skills and work ethic developed in the military, she has enjoyed various roles, working to prevent global financial crime.

In her spare time, Hannah enjoys helping Jake develop his film ideas and taking a supporting role behind the camera.

Young Leader, Gender Cool Champion

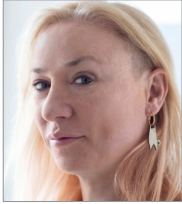
Champion Avis (they/them) is a queer non-binary student, actor, singer and model.

She now flies helicopters for the National Police Air Service, supporting Police Forces across the UK. Ayla came out as transgender around 2010 and remained serving with her operational Search and Rescue unit throughout. The support and pragmatism of her colleagues and the wider armed forces made that transitional time not only possible, but empowering and successful. Ayla is the professional she is today, because she wasn't forced to hide who she is.

In 2015 after taking part in a Stonewall Leadership Programme and delivering a Keynote speech at Stonewall's Workplace Conference, Ayla joined the Stonewall Trans Advisory Group, as Stonewall began its journey to being fully and proudly trans-inclusive, and now sits on the Stonewall Board of Trustees.

In 2018, Ayla was portrayed in the critically acclaimed stage production 'Still Point Turning' by the Sydney Theatre Company and featured as one of many 'RAF Stories' at the RAF Museum, London. Ayla also briefly flew Sea King helicopters again as a civilian after leaving the RAF, for the privately run Historic Helicopters.

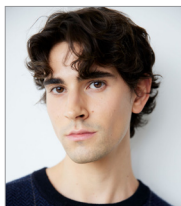
